Dr Paul Chapple was awarded a PhD by University College London in 1997, this investigated the physiological and evolutionary significance of Hsp70 chaperones in a marine organism. He then worked for eight years as a Postdoctoral Researcher in the laboratory of Professor Michael Cheetham at the UCL Institute of Ophthalmology, where he researched the cell biology of chaperone proteins involved in neurodegeneration and blindness. In 2004 he moved to the KCL Institute of Psychiatry to work with Dr Jean-Marc Gallo on the Alzheimer's protein Tau. Dr Chapple became a Lecturer at the William Harvey Research Institute in 2006 and was promoted to Reader in 2010.

He serves as a reviewer and committee member for grant-giving bodies, including current membership of BBSRC Committee D and previous membership of the Society for Endocrinology Science Committee.
